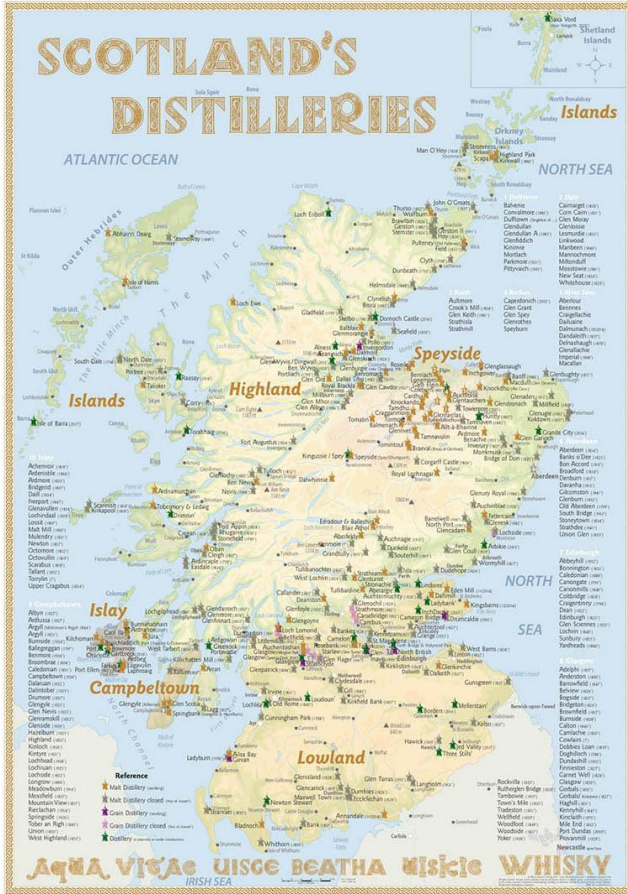

THE LOWLAND'S

AUCHENTOSHAN 12 YR

£14.50

Sweet and smooth with hints of toffee, vanilla, caramel, raisins, fruit cake, oak and pungent berries. A fairly thick nose on this with a strong sweet-syrupy note. Sweet on the palate with fruitful tannins and a dry fruity complexity.

AUCHENTOSHAN 18 YR

£30.00

Rife with toasty oak and vanilla spice, chocolate cake and a lovely grassiness, crystallized ginger finishing with a dark nuttiness chestnuts and almonds

GLENKINCHIE, 12 YR

£14.50

Fresh orange, raisins, green apples and honey. With some maple and brown sugar, oatmeal, sliced almonds on the palate. The finish is a flash of peat, smoke, cinnamon and sugar before a warm, dry, tingly mouthfeel which wets your appetite for another taste.

AILSABAY

£25.00

On The Nose Dark, serious notes of earth, tar, wet tarpaulin and liquorice combine deliciously with lighter aromas of roasted almonds and toasted oatmeal drenched in honey. Through the palate Sweet smoke and bonfire embers merge with liquorice, tarry rope and a refreshing hint of lemon, then soft notes of pear and oatmeal arrive. Youthful but characterful and punchy. To the end The dark flavours don't let up: plenty of smoky tar and liquorice

BLADNOCH, 16YR

£25.00

One of the last bottlings of the former owners, Bladnoch has had rather a checkered history most of us not knowing if it was in business from year to year. It is the most southern distillery in Scotland away down near Wigtown on the Scottish borders.

THE SPEY VALLEY

AUCHROISK, 10 YR

£14.00

The nose is malty and somewhat mineraly, but not very fruity, which comes as a bit of a surprise. Dried coconut, biscuits and tea on the palate. A touch of bitterness. The finish is medium long and drying.

CRAGGANMORE, 12 YR

£18.50

Fairly rich and buttery at first. Bitter-sweet caramel soaked in rum. Hints of raisin jam on the nose. In the back are some echoes of the malty base and coffee. Fine sandalwood, and aged sweet cigar wrappers.



CRAIGELLACHIE 1997

£21.50

Light fresh delicate, heather aromas that continue to the palate, on the palate a sublime yeasty flavour comes through to the finish.

LONGMORN GLENLIVET, 12 YR

£21.50

Beeswax and intense honey. Mead-like as it opens. Explosion of intense sweetness and honey aftertaste.

INCHGOWER, 14 YR

£17.50

It is nicely creamy and sweet, with a twist. A touch of candied sugar and marzipan, albeit in the background. Herbal with some thyme which then becomes a bit floral with violets and lavender

GLENLIVET 15 YR

£17.50

Smooth and welcoming, bright and lively gold. Fruity, summer-like fragrances that are well-balanced with strong pineapple notes. Creamy and smooth with marzipan and fresh hazelnut on the palate

GLENDROMACH 12YR

£17.00

Cinnamon, raisins caramelized sugar, raw ginger with creamy hazelnut aromas

GLENDROMACH 18YR

£40.00

Christmas cake flavours , hints of rum aromas chocolate coated hazelnuts flavors leading in to sauternes hints

BALVENIE



THE BALVENIE is a range of single malts crafted by Malt Master David Stewart. Each expression is unique, but all are rich, luxuriously smooth and underpinned by a distinctive honeyed character. Understanding his craft like few others, David uses different cask types and ages of spirit, to develop exquisite new interpretations of The Balvenie's classic character

BALVENIE, DOUBLE CASK 12YR

£15.50

Aged in refill American oak casks before being finished in first fill European oak sherry casks, double wood is an excellent example of what the balvenie cask craft even at 12 years

BALVENIE, CARRIBEAN CASK, 14YR

£21.50

Rich, sweet and creamy toffee on the nose combined with fresh fruit notes. Rounded with vanilla and sweet oak notes, with a fruity character climaxing with the finish which is soft and lingering.

BALVENIE, WEEK OF PEAT, 14YR

£21.50

The Balvenie distillery have dedicated one week of the year to produce a whisky 100% peated barley resulting Week of Peat bottlings

GLENFARCLAS



Since 1865 Glenfarclas has been owned and managed by just one family, the Grants of Glenfarclas. On the 8th of June 1865 John Grant acquired the tenancy for the Rechlerich Farm and as part of the transaction purchased the Glenfarclas Distillery. To this day Glenfarclas is one of only a few distilleries in Scotland to remain family owned and managed.

Now in the hands of the fifth and sixth generation of the family, the Grants remain committed to the vision of creating the best quality Single Highland Malt Scotch Whisky.

GLENFARCLAS, 105

£19.50

Amazingly smooth for the strength; wonderfully warming and with a lingering smokiness, yet very rounded.

GLENFARCLAS, 10 YR

£17.50

Sweet sherry, orange peel, honey and vanilla nose. It is smooth and delivers sherry soaked dried fruit, a smoky sweetness with vanilla and cinnamon. Long and spicy.

GLENFARCLAS, 15 YR

£18.50

Full amber in colour and no suggestion of artificial colouring. Sweet sherry, burnt toffee, leather and coca on the aroma. The palate is full of rich sherry cask influence. Finishes with toffee, crystal malt, burnt toast, sherry, coca, liquorish and some coffee-like bitterness

BENROMACH



Before the mid-1960s, Speyside distilleries malted their own barley. Hidden away in remote glens, they would top up their fires with cuts of local peat when coal was running low. These slices were enough to impart a touch of smoke in the region's whisky. With the advent of new commercial malting's in the 1960s, this subtle Speyside smokiness was lost to the world, but only for a while. Benromach Distillery gave the world back this lost style of whisky.

BENROMACH, 10 YR
£15.50

At first it starts like a sweet fruity perfume, flowery and light then it grows bigger and thicker. Crispy sourness of green apple, dried orange peel. On the palate, full bodied but heavenly light.

BENROMACH,, 15 YR
£18.50

Chai latte, lime peel and a whiff of rum-like spiciness. Dark chocolate, menthol and a dash of smoke. Creamy vanilla keeps this rather boisterous trio of flavours in check.

BENROMACH 21 YR
£43.00

Deep oloroso sherry comes through with stewed plums raspberry jam and juicy sultanas initially following by hints of Pinot Noir orange peel and dried apricots, Vanilla toasted brown sugar milk chocolate and aromatic ginger spice

GLENFIDDICH



For 20 years William Grant nurtured a dream to make the ‘best dram in the valley’. With the help of his family, he finally achieved that vision. In the summer of 1886, with his seven sons and two daughters by his side, William set out to fulfil a lifelong ambition. Together they began building his Distillery by hand, stone by stone. After a single year of work, it was ready, and William named it Glenfiddich, Gaelic for Valley of the Deer

GLENFIDDICH, 12 YR

£14.50

Distinctively fresh and fruity with a hint of pear. Beautifully crafted and delicately balanced. Characteristics are sweet and fruity which develops into butterscotch, cream, malt and subtle oak flavour. A long smooth and mellow finish.

GLENFIDDICH I.P.A

£16.50

An elegant harmony of fresh green apple, Williams pears and spring blossom, complimented with aromatic hops and fresh garden herbs

FIRE AND CANE

£16.50

Billowing soft peat notes, like distant smoke on the wind. Rich sweet toffee with zesty fresh fruit notes and spiciness, Like a Highland peat campfire, with oak notes and toffee. Sharp green fruit, sweet baked apple and soft smoke.

GLENFIDDICH PROJECT XX

£19.50

Classic fruitiness with hints of apple blossom and plump pear. A perfect balance of rich vanilla oak with golden sugar and a touch of liquorice, on the palate Deep and mellow, the candyfloss sweetness is complemented by unusual notes of toasted almonds and cinnamon and a hint of crisp tannin.

GLENFIDDICH, 15 YR

£20.50

Golden with an intriguingly complex aroma. Sweet heather honey and vanilla fudge combined with rich dark fruit. Silky smooth, revealing layers of sherry oak, marzipan, cinnamon and ginger. Full-bodied and bursting with flavour, satisfyingly rich with lingering sweetness.

GLENFIDDICH 21 YR WINTERSTORM

£65.00

Part of the experimental expressions of Glenfiddich, finished in a Canadian Ice wine cask this adds a softness to the whisky this not overpowering the balance of the experience but does give it a length of finish that is extraordinary long.

GLENFIDDICH, 21 YR

£65.00

Dark gold with intense vanilla sweetness. Floral, hints of banana, fig, rich toffee, new leather and oak. Initially soft, then brisk, vibrant and drying. Very long, warming, dry and spice

GLENGOYNE



Highly regarded as Scotland's most beautiful distillery, Glengoyne Distillery was established in 1833 and is owned by one of Scotland's most respected family-owned companies, Ian Macleod Distillers. Glengoyne, uncompromising in its pursuit of excellence and honouring the traditions of its founders, runs its stills slower than any other distillery in order to create the complex, sweet flavours for which it is known.

GLENGOYNE, 15 YR

£30.00

Complex, sweet and rounded with a spicy oak finish. This is the taste of distilling slower than anyone else in Scotland. The flavours develop in hand-selected sherry casks.

GLENGOYNE, 10 YR

£16.50

Fresh green apple, toffee and a hint of nuttiness. This is the taste of distilling slower than anyone else in Scotland, of barley dried by air (never peat) and of oak casks selected by hand.

GLENGOYNE, 21 YR

£45.00

Christmas cake, honey and rich fruit with a long cinnamon finish. Perfect after dinner, or frankly, anytime.

GLENGOYNE 30 YR

£150.00

Made from one third first fill European oak sherry butts and two thirds refill sherry butts Glengoyne 30 year old has notes of black cherry marmalade, rum and raisin, cinnamon and plum compote

HIGHLAND

INVERLOCHY CASTLE MALT

£13.00

This single malt exudes some beautiful coffee, chocolate and toffee peat notes, a firm representative of the western highland style

BEN NEVIS COIRE LEIS

£16.00

Woody spice, barley sugar, spiced fruits cake buttery notes, toasted oak baked apple

DALWHINNIE, 15 YR

£15.50

Full bodied and nice texture. Spices, sweet chocolate, mocha and cinnamon on the nose. Gets sweeter over time.

GLEN GARIOCH, 12 YR

£15.50

Spicy with some upfront caramel fudge notes. Citrus and green apple emerge late. Fairly light body. Warming with nice mouth feel.

GLENMORANGIE ORIGINAL

£15.50

Intense floral, caramelized fruits, citrus and banana with hint of fennel. Following through on the palate with sweet and intense pure fruit flowers with a light nuttiness, chalk and candy floss.



OBAN, 14 YR

£16.50

Clean and crisp with notes of light vanilla, sweet spices and fragrant with a touch of smoke-dried peels. Firm oak with a soft sweet start. With a zesty character running all the way through. Very clean notes of mint orange syrup.

TAMDHU, 10 YR

£17.00

Light aromas with a trace of honey sweetness. It has a little mellow fruit coming through on the palate which continues through to the finish.

WOLFBURN

£15.50

Initially sweet with notes of fruit and fresh sea air. In the background, you'll find citrus freshness and hints of cereal, and just a trace of peat smoke

CAMPBELLTOWN

GLEN SCOTIA, VICTORIANA

£27.00

Rich auburn in colour, intense aromas of raisin, oloroso sherry tones with a smoky balance that is very much an extrovert style nose. This continues through the palate, that fills the mouth with sweet flavours of fig chutney, ginger and that beautiful smoky fire tones.

HAZELBURN, 10YR

£15.50

Pale gold, almost straw colour. Full of fresh citrus aromas that combine into jasmine tea, light oak orange blossom and apple sponge. The palate is full of rich jasmine tea that is rich and sensual with the finish being full of white chocolate.

SPRINGBANK



SPRINGBANK, 10 YR

£15.50

Light gold. Light additive oak shaving notes with smoke, ripe fruits, extra virgin oil, fragrant oak rich and charred and a light citrus lift. The palate starts sweet then goes on to become rich in black olives. The smoke nature of the whisky comes through on the finish.

SPRINGBANK, 15 YR

£21.50

Lots of rich fruit apricot jam, satsuma segments and apple pie, with wafts of sea breeze and baking spices, continues into the palate vanilla, fruit with ginger and cinnamon bring a dryness to the palate

SPRINGBANK 18YR

£48.00

Honeycomb oily smoke black pepper dried citrus peels candied tropical fruits Carmel on the finish

THE ISLANDS

HIGHLAND PARK, 12 YR

£16.50

Light gold. There are strong fruit aromas on the nose with a sublime peat character. Berry fruits dominate the palate that fill the mouth. The peat adds depth to the mouth feel curating intense concentration of flavours.

HIGHLAND PARK VALKYRE

25.50

Hints of peat on the nose with a aromas reminiscent of a sea breeze developing into the berry fruits that are a distinctive trait of the highland park distillery.

HIGHLAND PARK 18YR

£35.00

Vibrant and intense aromas of ruby red fruits and warm vanilla complement the fiery bitter sweetness of cinnamon bark and the smouldering richness of the devilishly dark chocolate

TALISKER, 10 YR

£16.50

Gold smoky fires, heather honey, liquorice root has an earthy bonfire nose with pork crackling. There is also a hint of light seaweed and undertones of sweetness. The palate experience starts where you get cracked black pepper.



BOWMORE, 12 YR

£27.00

Rich gold, toasty oak, some date and a little orange zest. The palate is sweet herbs, toffee and a slight salty and smoky finish.

BOWMORE 18 YR

£38.00

Pungent citrus stewed fruits hints of damp wood, sweetness plum jam and hints of orange Marmalade on the finish

BOWMORE 25YR

Aged in American Bourbon and Spanish Sherry casks, The Sherry influence combines wonderfully with the coastal smokey distillery style to create a sublime aged single malt

ISLAND OF ISLAY

ARDBEG, 10YR

£19.50

Pale gold and lots of American oak. Custard apple and vanilla lightly medicinal, then grapefruit and the flavours of kelp. Finishing with smoked toffee

ARDBEG CORRYVRECKEN

£30.00

Powerfully peaty and immensely satisfying , Ardbegs Corryvrecken is what is what happens when the distillery of Islay's Kildalton Coast aims to make a whisky with a particularly Medicinal style than its usual expressions

BUNNAHABHAN 18YR

£46.00

Non chill filtered, cherry notes salted candy and rich sherry flavours roasted chestnuts finishing with mixed spices

CAOL ILA, 12 YR

£19.50

Light gold, soft easy-going peat flavours. This gentle nature continues through the palate with hints of lime and candied fruit.

LAPHROAIG, 10 YR

£19.50

Intense iodine on the nose very medicinal reminiscent of TCP, the seaweed nature does not change on the palate it explodes in the mouth taking no prisoners filling your mouth with buckets of maritime peat flavours

LAGAVULIN, 16YR

£29.00

Intense iodine aromas on the nose and complex peat aromas going through to the palate

BLACK ART,

£150.00

Refined peat aromas gentle oak that develops into a coco/ Chocolate flavour with a coffee finish

SINGLE GRAIN WHISKY

GIRVAN PATENT STILL NO 4 APPS

£21.50

In 2013, Grant's took the decision to introduce a range of Single Grain whiskies from their Girvan distillery in Ayrshire. This is their no-age-statement expression, matured in American oak casks

CAMERON BRIG, 8YR

£12.50

This single grain whisky was distilled at the Cameronbridge distillery in Fife. A very light and gentle whisky.

ENGLISH MALT WHISKEY

ST GEORGE, CHAPTER 13

£19.00

Described as both 'fun and serious', St George's Distillery's dragon-themed English Whiskey Chapter 13 was launched at 1300 hours on Friday 13 September 2013. Bottled at 49% (because $4+9=13$), this is an intensely flavoured sweet and spicy whiskey with one of the coolest labels you'll see.

BLENDED AND DELUXE WHISKY

BELLS, 8YR

£10.00

The United Kingdom's most popular blended Scottish whisky, this is the standard release of Bells Original. With notes of fresh herbs on the nose with cereal sweetness on the palate.

MONKEY SHOULDER

£16.50

Monkey Shoulder is a mix of three different Single Malts - Glenfiddich, Balvenie and Kininvie - and is great with a mixer or just on its own. Smooth, sweet and very easy to drink.

JOHNNIE WALKER BLACK LABEL

£10.50

Possibly the most famous of the Johnnie Walker range. Generally a blend of over 40 single malt whiskies all aged for at least 12 years.

JOHNNIE WALKER BLUE LABEL

£65.00

Johnnie Walkers Premium blend, there is no age statement on the bottle, also known as Max Walker. It is a blend to create the character and taste of some of the earliest whisky blends created in the 19th century.

COPPER DOG

£16.50

A blended malt Scotch whisky named after a little piece of kit used once upon a time by distillery workers to covertly sneak whisky home. Eight different whiskies from Speyside were combined to create this well-balanced blend.

IRISH WHISKEY

BUSHMILLS

£9.50

A rich and dark Irish blend; Black Bush contains a high proportion of triple-distilled single malt. Aged in Oloroso sherry casks for around 8-10 years before marriage with the grain.

JAMESON

£10.50

Full gold, herbs, hot earth amber, soft with lots of vanilla. Succulent mid-palate then starts to dry, becoming slightly finer and spiced.

BUSHMILLS, 10 YR

£13.50

Gold, green grass moving into light hay, with aromas of soft wood balsawood and clover. Crisp but with vanilla sweetness from ex-bourbon casks.

BLACK BUSH

£12.50

Full gold, clean oak, spiced and galia melon with a little date, black grape juice, then firm coconut and cedar. There is a hint of barley sugar on the palate.

YELLOW SPOT

£34.00

Rather than being simply a finished whiskey, Yellow Spot is special in that it contains single pot still whiskey that has been matured for a full 12-year period in three oak cask types.

TEELING

£25.00

Teeling's single malt contains whiskeys aged for up to 23 years, which have been matured in a range of wine casks: Sherry, Port, Madeira, White Burgundy and Cabernet Sauvignon. A rich and spicy whiskey.

TULLAMORE



Daniel E. Williams the creator of Tullamore D.E.W. A self-made man who worked his way up from a stable boy of the distillery to become the owner he brought electricity, and motorised automobiles to Tullamore and created a whiskey so distinctive and character- filled, it could only be stamped with his initials D.E.W

TULLAMORE D.E.W

£12.50

Tullamore Dew is a resoundingly popular Irish blend, particularly in overseas markets, where it is second only to Jameson. Very approachable.

TULLAMORE D.E.W Phoenix

£25.00

The higher strength tingles on the tongue from this whisky leaving a spicy pot still flavour. Addition of a little water releases layers of Caramel sweetness, delicate floral notes and oak tannins

TULLAMORE D.E.W 18YR Single Malt

£33.00

Spicy malt with developing hints of sherry-soaked raisin and cinnamon, soft fruit as it opens, leading into bourbon- cask vanilla and toasted bread, finishing with caramel and chocolate, with a hint of zesty orange and fruit cake

BOURBONS AND CANADIAN WHISKY

CANADIAN CLUB

£10.50

A giant of Canadian whiskey created in 1858 and spending six long years in oak before bottling for the smoothest possible flavour.

JACK DANIELS

£10.50

The original all-conquering cola-friendly colossus, Jack Daniel's No. 7 commands a legion of fans worldwide, thanks to the sweet smoothness imparted by the Lincoln County Process of charcoal-mellowing the spirit before maturation.

WOODFORD RESERVE

£17.50

Rich and full-bodied, Woodford Reserve is a delicious bourbon, triple distilled for extra smoothness. Loaded with notes of dried fruit and sweet spice.

CROWN ROYAL RYE

£21.50

Award winning Rye whisky from Canada, full bodied with a complexed vanilla finish
